We've also expanded our collection of **miniature Vandaceous, miniature Dendrobiums, miniature Oncidinae & divisions of some of our select Paphs** in addition to **Miscellaneous Genera** ~ all of which grow & flower happily with our Phals. Each genus is put into their own category after our Phal. listings.

Most plants are in 2.7 - 3" pots as first or second bloomers unless otherwise noted as being in 4" pots  
Stock quantities of 6 or fewer are noted in parens

## **ORDERING INFORMATION FOR OUR MAIL ORDER CLIENTS:**

In the winter or during inclement weather, shipments may be delayed pending more moderate weather conditions. Shipping is either via FedEx Ground or Air depending on the final destination. We reserve the right to withdraw any offering from sale and to limit quantities. We guarantee all plants to be true to identity to the best of our knowledge. However, since many come in from Taiwan, we have to assume they are properly labeled as to their species or hybrid name. We make no warranty as to the productiveness of any plants sold since everyone's culture conditions vary widely.

Although we do our utmost to pack carefully, we are not responsible for damage to buds or flowers due to shipping if buyer specifically requests these plants ~ therefore, risk is assumed by buyer for buds or flowers on plants shipped at this stage  
Safe arrival of a healthy orchid plant is guaranteed.

### **Packing & Shipping Charges:**

Based on the total of your order, a minimum of 10% for packing plus the actual FedEx shipping cost will be charged. We use FedEx Ground for all 1-3 day deliveries within our delivery zone since Ground shipping rates are much more reasonable than Air.  
If heat packs are requested, they will be provided for an additional \$4.50.

**Additional Shipping Note:** FedEx charges an extra \$3.50 for "Home Delivery" so many of our clients choose to have their plants delivered to either their office or to a nearby FedEx Ship Center that accepts "Hold for Pickup" packages ~ those business/FedEx locations always get their deliveries much earlier in the day than the average Home Delivery. If you want to save the additional charge levied for Home Delivery, please let us know if you have a business address you would like to use, or we can research a FedEx location near you that would accept a Ground or Express package as a "Hold for Pickup".

During the colder months of the year, having your plants sent to either your business address or a FedEx location as a "Hold for Pickup" usually means it's delivered much earlier in the day & is not exposed to riding around on a cold delivery vehicle for additional hours. So whenever possible, we highly recommend doing this.

**PF** = Previously flowered, fully mature Blooming Size plants  
**F** = Currently in flower (single spike unless otherwise noted)  
**B** = In bud (single spike unless otherwise noted)  
**SP** = In spike, just initiating to medium spike stage (single spike unless otherwise noted)  
**BS** = Blooming size (should flower in season)  
**NBS** = Near blooming size (approximately 1 year to flowering in season)  
**S** = about 2-3 years to flowering

**PHAL SPECIES:**

*Most of these Phalaenopsis species are from Taiwan & reflect much improved forms & colors, having been sibbed or selfed using very select parents. Species like Phal. bellina, violacea, venosa, speciosa, gigantea and javanica are extremely slow to reach maturity & can be easily lost as small seedlings so we're only offering well-established Near Blooming or Blooming Size plants. As a result of their extra years to reach maturity, the pricing on these plants is higher than is usual for quicker growing & more readily available Phal. species.*

	<p>Phal. aphrodite subsp. formosana 'A09001' (4N) <i>(TETRAPLOID FORM of Species)</i></p> <p><i>A dynamite tetraploid form of this favorite of all Phal. species ! This clone is producing more compact leaves and much larger flowers than is typical for this subspecies of aphrodite. Its fuller form &amp; beautifully round flowers with the petals almost touching carries great substance &amp; produces a much longer-lasting display with a smaller leaf span than is typical for this species. This cerulean strain has a blue flush which, along with its deep lavender lip, makes quite a statement. This species will continue to flower on older inflorescences in addition to producing new. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phal. cornu-cervi</b> fma. chattaladae 4N (Mericlone)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>(TETRAPLOID form)</b></p> <p><i>This is the genuine chattaladae form of Phal. cornu-cervi from David Grove, owner of the only known plant of this variety.</i></p> <p><b><i>OF NOTE:</i></b> There are other red forms of Phal. cornu-cervi being offered – but they are actually fma. rubescens or a cross between fma. rubescens and possibly fma. chattaladae....all showing a hint of yellow in their lateral sepals and most with a yellow back to the flowers. Fma. chattaladae has a totally solid red back to its flowers with no hint of yellow anywhere except the very tips of the lateral sepals, &amp; it retains its solid red color, even on the fading flowers, whereas fma. rubescens will begin to show yellow as the flowers fade.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">BS (1)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>JUST IN</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">\$ 65</p>

The flowers are fuller and much longer lasting than is typical for the species which leads us to wonder if it's a tetraploid (4N) population. Their vigorously branching spikes make this strain highly desirable. 

Same compact leaf span &amp; spike height as all the other members of this species with the potential to produce a keiki on its previously flowered spike. Beautifully compact spikes are produced on their first flowering. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phal. schilleriana 'Wilson'</b> (Silver leaf form x Spot leaf form)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>("Silver Leaf" form of Species)</i></p> <p><i>This particular sibling of two forms of this species has resulted in beautifully mottled silvery leaves with a distinct &amp; well defined spotting pattern ! This particular clone is an amazingly strong grower for the species with firm leaves &amp; heavier substance flowers. We have found that this species does best for us grown under slightly lower light than we give our Phalaenopsis hybrids &amp; the waxier summer-flowering species. 	<p><b>Phal. speciosa (tetraspis) var. christiana</b> (‘C#1’ AM/AOS x self)</p> <p><i>(Two-tone color form of Species)</i></p> <p><b>A unique color form of this species which has been recognized &amp; awarded by the AOS both as Phal. tetraspis and Phal. speciosa var. christiana ! So neither the taxonomists nor the AOS judging system can yet agree with what it actually should be called. However, this particular selfing has produced the same two-tone fragrant flowers as its parent with the potential for some to flower with the odd solid red flower. When in full flower, it makes an arresting display of color with no two flowers exhibiting the same red accents.  <p><i>This is an actual photo of our plant when it flowered in April ! The green really comes out under brighter &amp; cooler conditions.</i></p>	<p><b>Phal. tetraspis ‘Green’</b> <i>(Green tipped form of Species)</i></p> <p><b>We sold out of these the minute we posted them a year ago ~ but we just found a few more to share ! When flowered in the winter, its green influence is not as strong as when it flowers during the spring or fall when it’s brighter &amp; cooler. Previously flowered spikes will stay green so don’t remove them but allow them to continue to produce additional flowers in season while still creating new flowering spikes. These have the same growing &amp; flowering conditions as all Phal. tetraspis (speciosa) species. Some of the 'C#1' selfings have produced a solid red flower but additional flowers on the same spikes proved to be more like the two-tone 'C#1' clone. 	<p><b>Phal. tetraspis 'Spots'</b>  <i>(Spotted form of Species)</i></p> <p><b>A unique variation among all Phal. tetraspis species, possibly the result of a 'C#1' selfing ! Covered with a random spotting pattern, its richness of color is intensified under cooler &amp; brighter conditions. Beautiful glossy green undulating leaves with cascading spikes around 5-7" long. In nature this species grows wet all year so fertilize and keep moist year round. Previously flowered spikes can continue to add buds in addition to new spikes emerging so don't remove older spikes until they turn brown. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phal. violacea fma. alba</b> <i>('Wanchiao' SM/TOGA x sib: Species)</i></p> <p><i>A not often available alba form of this wonderfully fragrant species ! The clone 'Wanchiao' was recognized in Taiwan with a Silver Medal for its confirmation &amp; pure alba color, some seedlings touched just slightly with a whisper of green on the outer edges of their segments. Waxy long-lasting fragrant flowers are produced on very compact spikes which cascade gently over a compact leaf span. Previously flowered spikes will remain green &amp; continue to add buds in addition to creating new spikes, with the species eventually surrounded bearing multiple spikes gently arching over compact leaves. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phal. zebrina</b> (Sib cross of Species)</p> <p><i>Endemic to Myanmar, Thailand, Borneo &amp; Sumatra, this rarely available &amp; fragrant warm growing waxy species flowers in the spring &amp; summer ! We've already flowered a couple from this sib cross &amp; their flower size &amp; crisp marks have been sensational. This species carries horizontal to erect 4" long spikes, producing up to 5+ flowers. ### **PHALAEENOPSIS HYBRIDS**

*Most of these clones are the result of cutting-edge Taiwanese breeding programs & are plants we've hand-selected from some of the most forward thinking nurseries during our annual trips to Taiwan to judge their TIOS Orchid Show. The advantage to many of the Multi-floral Minis is that they tend to spike more than once a year due to their breeding background. We've actually discovered that many were spiking again within 6-9 months after the initial flowering was over !*

**PLEASE NOTE:** *With many of the harlequins & the red or orange novelties, differences in light & temperature at various times of the year will cause some variation to occur in the flower color and/or intensity of their markings. Under warmer temperatures & more shaded conditions in the summer, many red novelty-type hybrids with yellow or orange in their breeding background will flower showing more of the influence of those colors. Under cooler temperatures & brighter light in the fall to winter months, the red pigment in the flowers is more strongly expressed resulting in solid to nearly solid red flowers.*

*Also, many hybrids with a heavy Harlequin influence will show their boldest and most vivid colors when bloomed under cooler temperatures & brighter light during the fall & winter.*

*In addition, many of the Novelty-type hybrids with Phal. bellina and/or violacea in their background improve in color intensity and size with fuller form on their 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> flowerings, as do the actual species parents.*

Its flowers are heavily suffused with harlequin spotting melding to a dark rich burgundy (darker than our photo shows) covering most of the flowers, leaving just a charming pink picotee as a halo around its segments. This particular hybrid also has very attractively variegated foliage as opposed to the traditional dark green leaves of other clones of this hybrid. Evarise Blue Angel</b> (Mericlone) <i>(Purple Martin x lobbii)</i></p> <p><i>This is one of those totally delightful multi-floral miniatures that we awarded an AM/AOS at a recent Taiwan International Orchid Show ~ FRAGRANT &amp; BLUE ! This little wonder is capable of producing two or more compact spikes as first bloomers over equally compact leaf spans ~ the one sample we hand-carried back, bare root, from Taiwan in March &amp; in flower at the time is still flowering on its original spikes, 6 months later ! Its crowning glory is the lobbii-type lip which sets off the cerulean blue flowers with an accent of rich purple-blue. Cooler &amp; brighter conditions always produce the most vivid color. A ready brancher with nice compact spikes in perfect proportion to the plant, its full form flowers are 2 ½" in size, a nice mid-size between larger flowered hybrids &amp; multi-floral miniatures. A delightful 2-tone multi-floral mini with that fabulously contrasting broad brilliant red-orange lobbii-type lip ! Capable of producing multitudes of branching spikes for an amazingly floriferous presentation ~ many of these spiked again within 2 months, meaning twice a year flowering. And this year we discovered that the cooler nights of fall to winter encouraged these same plants to create up to 6 spikes each ! Liu's Triprince for its sparkling golden yellow lobbii-type lip set against charmingly small white flowers ! This hybrid was noted as a great achievement in giving Phal. lobbii hybrids a better presentation, flower quality and floriferousness, producing compact readily branching spikes over equally compact leaf spans. 



There are only a few so far that meet those standards for us, & we're excited to be able to share some of them with everyone.



### **SELECT ONE-OF-A-KIND NOVELTY SEEDLINGS:**

Many of our novelty or select seedlings will be flowering for the first time for us this spring into fall ~ and with Phal. bellina in the background of many, as first bloomers they will initially produce only 1-3 flowers on their first spikes. This type of breeding is extremely slow to grow to maturity due to the heavy influence of the slower-growing waxy Phal species in their background. With these waxy novelties, we leave any still-green spikes on the plants since they will most likely add more buds to these spikes in addition to producing new spikes at their next flowering. Some people choose to remove the initial spikes & give the energy back to the plant. However, we've never noticed (with novelty-type breeding) that it makes much difference in the overall vigor of the plant since their parentage carries the habit of retaining older spikes. Also, their flower form, color and size improve enormously with their 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> flowerings. But ~ the real bonus to owning a One-of-a-Kind plant is that you can give it your own clonal name !

### **OTHER GENERA WHICH GROW HAPPILY UNDER PHALAENOPSIS CONDITIONS:**

#### **MINIATURE VANDACEOUS:**

All these species & hybrids grow & flower easily WITH our Phals under the same light & temperature conditions since they are miniature growers, requiring much lower light than their larger-growing & flowering cousins. We're growing them in deep small plastic baskets to allow their roots to dry slightly between waterings. In the winter we slip these little baskets into rose pots to allow the roots to continue to grow down from the basket, our own approach to "collaring" that Alan Koch of Gold Country Orchids does with his plants in clay pots. These are mostly miniature, & a few compact, growing species & hybrids, many of which will readily form basal keikis to become beautiful specimen miniatures producing multitudes of spikes at the same time on all of their mature growths. And most of them are also delightfully FRAGRANT !



They will grow equally well under intermediate temperatures although we grow them just a bit warmer with our Phalaenopsis.
